Celebrating Culture

Culture is the characteristics and knowledge of a particular group of people, encompassing language, religion, cuisine, social habits, music, and arts.

Create a video telling us who you are and what your culture is.

Introduce yourself

How do you identify yourself and culture? Who was the first member of your family that came to America? Where did they come from and when did this happen? Where were you born?

How many people are in your family?

How does your family, friends, and nation influence who you are?

- What is important to you?
- What morals standards have your family or friends instilled in you?
- Share a personal experience that was meaningful to you.
- What is a tradition or activity that is important to you and your family?
- What is your favorite meal that someone in your family makes?

Next, talk about the steps you took to create your portrait. Use art terminology while explaining your work. For example, In my portrait, I used a wide range of value to create a three-dimensional feeling. This helps make my portrait appear more realistic. I drew my head so that my eyes were on the upper third portion of my paper to create a balanced composition. Etc. (You can not copy this. It should be in your **own** words.) Use the elements and principles of design worksheet to help you describe your portrait.

Your video should be 2-5 minutes long.

You will be graded on your video quality. Consider the following.

- Find a quiet place to videotape. We should not hear people in the background.
- The camera should be still and pan smoothly.
- There should be shots of the portrait and yourself
- Count out three seconds from when you start recording and when you start talking to avoid cutting off words. Do the same when you end the tape.
